Herb	Basil	African Blue	-	African blue basil is a hybrid basil variety, a cross between camphor basil and dark opal basil. It is one of a few types of basil that are perennial. African blue basil plants are sterile, unable to produce seeds of their own, and can only be propagated by cuttings.
Herb	Basil	Genovese	-	Authentic Italian heirloom variety for perfect pesto, tomato dishes & pasta and more. Produces abundant, intensely fragrant, richly flavored glossygreen leaves on branching, productive plants.
Herb	Basil	Italian Pesto	-	Glossy dark green leaves and full-bodied zesty flavor is the classic strain for making pesto. Combine the delicious leaves with garlic, olive oil, grated cheese and toasted nuts to make homemade pesto sauce for pasta, baked potatoes or to accent fish or poultry, season soups and stews, or enhance salad dressings. You'll have luscious leafy harvests all summer with plenty to freeze for winter feasting too!
Herb	Basil	Mammoth	-	Featuring extra large, lettuce-like leaves with exceptional flavor, Mammoth Basil might be that variety you never knew you were missing from your kitchen garden!
Herb	Basil	Thai	-	Thai basil is a popular herb in Southeast Asian cuisine. It holds its flavor and texture better after cooking than other basil varieties and adds a kick to salads when sliced and eaten fresh. Thai's dark purple flowers and intoxicating scent make it a beautiful addition to the flower garden. A terrific container variety.
Herb	Chamomile	-	-	Chamomile or camomile is the common name for several daisy-like plants of the family Asteraceae. Two of the species, <i>Matricaria chamomilla</i> and <i>Chamaemelum nobile</i> , are commonly used to make herbal infusions for beverages.
Herb	Lemon Balm	-	-	Lemon balm (<i>Melissa officinalis</i>), a member of the mint family, is considered a calming herb.
Herb	Oregano			Oregano is a species of flowering plant in the mint family Lamiaceae. It was native to the Mediterranean region, but widely naturalised elsewhere in the temperate Northern Hemisphere. Oregano is a woody perennial plant, growing 20–80 cm tall.
Herb	Parsley	Italian	-	Italian parsley is a variety of the parsley plant used as an herb in a wide range of cuisines around the world. The slender stems give way to dark, flat leaves that taste robust and fresh.
Herb	Savory	Winter	-	Satureja montana, is a perennial, semi-evergreen herb in the family Lamiaceae, native to warm temperate regions of southern Europe, the Mediterranean, and Africa. It has dark green leaves and summer flowers ranging from pale lavender, or pink to white. The closely related summer savory is an annual plant.

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Herb	Thyme	Lemon	-	Thymus citriodorus, the lemon thyme or citrus thyme, is a lemon-scented evergreen mat-forming perennial plant in the family Lamiaceae. There has been a great amount of confusion over the plant's correct name and origin.
Miscellaneous	California Buckeye	-	-	Aesculus californica. California/Santa Clara County native tree. Between 15-40' tall with a spread of 30-60'. Full sun to part shade. Grows as a multi-trunk, rounded tree with silver-white bark and large compound leaves. Leaves appear in late winter/early spring, followed by fragrant, white, bottlebrush-like flowers on branch ends. Its flowers serve as an important nectar source for native bees and migrating butterflies. Large, spherical seeds form in summer as the tree tends to go deciduous. Mature seeds drop in fall and germinate readily. Water twice a month once established. Drought tolerant, but its appearance is improved with some water. May be kept as a specimen in a large (30+ gallon) container and can flower in as little as five years. Caution: All parts of the fruit are toxic.
Miscellaneous	California Sand Aster	-	-	Corethrogyne filaginifolia. California/Santa Clara County native perennial. Up to 1' tall and 4' wide. Full sun to part shade. A dense carpet of evergreen, silvery foliage that sports a multitude of lavender, daisy-like flowers from summer into fall. Tolerates clay soil. Water once a week once established or naturalize.
Miscellaneous	Cat Grass	(Oat)	-	Fibrous cat grass can be served fresh, year-round to assist your cat with digestion, and may help prevent furballs. Grass is ready for cats to eat when it is 2"-4" high; place near their water or food bowl for only a few minutes so that they don't binge. Feed for a few minutes at a time on a regular basis to get your kitty's tummy used to it, allowing absorption of all the nutrients. Great for dogs, too!
Miscellaneous	Cat Nip/ Cat Mint	-	-	Catnip is a multi-purpose plant. The tea is very pleasant with a lemonmint flavor and fragrance. Along with fresh catnip planted in containers indoors year-round, catnip toys filled with dried leaves will provide your feline friends with hours of fun. But be warned; they may ignore you for a while! Catnip is very hardy and grows in almost any soil; self-sows readily.
Miscellaneous	Citrus	Calamansi	-	Prized in the Philippines. Prolific fruit production with small sour orange fruit used as a lime. Fragrant blooms enhance this ornamental tree.
Miscellaneous	Gooseberry	Ayacucho Giant Cape	-	Physalis peruviana. Perennial. 1'-3' tall. A varietal cape gooseberry, recently found in the Ayacucho region of Peru by plant explorer J. Simcox. It bears plump fruits, larger in size than standard cape gooseberries, with excellent, sweet flavor. Protect from frost. May be grown in a large container. Commonly marketed as "goldenberries" in grocery stores.
Miscellaneous	Hummingbird Sage	-	-	Salvia spathacea. California native perennial. 1-3' tall and spreads by rhizomes to a width of ~4'. Full sun, part shade or shade. Evergreen. Deep rose-pink flowers bloom on tall central stalks from spring to summer. Loved by hummingbirds. Can be deadheaded and lightly pruned in summer if a neater appearance is desired. Water twice a month once established. Drought tolerant, but supplemental water improves the look of its foliage.

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Miscellaneous	Narrowleaf Milkweed	-	-	Asclepias fascicularis. California/Santa Clara County native perennial. Winter deciduous. Up to 3' tall and 1' wide. Full sun to part shade. Host plant for the monarch and queen butterflies. Pinkish-white flowers bloom from June to September. Spreads to form small colonies. Protect from caterpillars during first year to aid in establishment and ensure plants are large enough to provide adequate forage. Cut down to 8" in early winter. Water twice a month once established. Drought tolerant.
Miscellaneous	Raspberry	Heritage		Heirloom. This flavorful everbearing variety is very productive, with medium to large, firm, red fruit. It produces from mid-summer into fall on vigorous, hardy canes. A popular variety worldwide, it is good for fresh eating, freezing, and processing.
Miscellaneous	Scarlet Monkeyflower	-	-	Erythranthe cardinalis. California/Santa Clara County native perennial. Up to 3' tall and 2' wide. Full sun to part shade, but it seems to do best in partially shaded areas. An herbaceous, creeping plant with downy, apple green leaves and tubular orange-red flowers that is a hummingbird magnet. Blooms from summer into fall. Cut back hard in late fall or early winter to improve appearance. Self-sows. Does well in containers. Provide regular water.
Miscellaneous	Valerian	-	-	Valeriana officinalis. Perennial. Part of the Caprifoliaceae family, valerian produces white to light pink flowers in the spring that grow in clusters of branched panicles. Growing three to five feet tall, it has light green leaves that are small and almost fern like on the main stem of the plant. Dies back to the ground in winter. Grows in sun/part shade and average to wet, well-drained soils. Protect from harsh afternoon sunlight. May be container grown.
Miscellaneous	Yarrow	-	-	Achillea millefolium. California/Santa Clara County native perennial. Up to 3' tall and 1.5' wide. Full sun to part shade. Abundant umbels of tiny, white flowers appear above soft fronds of small, green leaflets from spring through summer. Attracts numerous pollinators. Considered semi-evergreen, yarrow naturally goes dormant as seeds are maturing, but foliage can be kept green with supplemental water. Spreads by rhizomes. Yarrow's durability, adaptability, and low water requirements make it a good groundcover plant for lawn replacement. Can be watered up to once a week once established or naturalized.
Vegetable	Bean - Bush	Blue Lake Bush Bean 274	60	Blue Lake 274 merits its longtime popularity and standing as a classic. Heirloom plants produce plump, tender 5–6" white-seeded pods prolifically over a long season. Fiber-free beans are delicious stir-fried, steamed—or sautéed, and accented with garlic. Early-yielding plants require no support.
Vegetable	Bean - Pole	Fortex	60	Dependable favorite with excellent flavor. Growing to over 11", requires trellising, produces extra-long round pods. Early and very productive, the beans may be picked at 7" length for extra-slender "filet" beans. Green, firm-textured pods are completely stringless and delicious at all lengths, even after the seeds enlarge. Walnut brown seeds.
Vegetable	Bean - Pole	French Pole Filet Gold	60	These hard-to-find, handsome yellow filet pole beans were originally bred by French seedmen for their domestic market. French Gold are true "haricot verts" beans: classically slim, round 7-9" pods with delicate, sweet flavor and a crispy snap that makes them especially choice eating. The heavy bearing, vigorous vines yield extra-fancy, juicy pods to enjoy over a long season of harvest.
Vegetable	Bean - Pole	Kentucky Wonder	70	The classic variety for heavy crops of meaty, tender, 6" long pods with delicious flavor. Easy to grow & productive over a long harvest period. Vines are vigorous with heavy yields.

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Vegetable	Bean - Pole	Rattlesnake Snap	60-90	(aka Preacher Bean) Distinctive dark green pods streaked with purple grow up to 8" long. Light buff seeds splashed with dark brown, resembling a rattlesnake's coloration. Very fine flavor. Vines grow vigorously to 10'. Good resistance to drought.
Vegetable	Bean - Pole	Yard Long Red	50-80	The red pods grow to 24-26" and are tender to 18". Pink red seeds. Very reliable, trouble-free variety excellent for the home garden. The red color is retained with cooking. The pods are stringless and the flavor is similar to asparagus. Good in stir fries.
Vegetable	Cantaloupe	Charentais	75-90	A true French cantaloupe that originated in the Poitou-Charentes region circa 1920. Considered by many to be the most divine and flavorful melon in the world. Smooth round melons mature to a creamy gray with faint ribs. Sweet, juicy, orange flesh with a heavenly fragrance. Typically the size of a grapefruit and weighing 2 lbs — perfect for two people.
Vegetable	Cantaloupe	Hale's Best Jumbo	80	1920s overnight muskmelon sensation, owing its popularity to excellent flavor with earliness. Beautifully ribbed oval melon with deep-green skin and golden netting. Firm, salmon-toned flesh is aromatic and sweet. A refreshing breakfast treat and a savory hors d'oeuvre when partnered with prosciutto. Thrives in hot weather. Plant at the base of a trellis so vines can climb.
Vegetable	Cantaloupe	Minnesota Midget	60-70	This delightful little melon introduced in 1948 by the University of Minnesota produces loads of 4" fruit, sweet and juicy to the rind. Melons in general, love long, hot seasons, but this variety is specially suited to areas with a short growing season, though it can be grown anywhere. Compact, 36" plants, great for containers. Plants are Fusarium wilt resistant.
Vegetable	Corn	Blue Jade	75	One of the only sweet corns that can be grown in containers, the 3' tall plants of this variety bear 3-6 ears. Peak time for eating is when kernels are just turning blue, but can be eaten when white or steel blue. This variety is from Dutch seedsman and Seed Savers Exchange member Kees Sahin. Great for fresh eating or freezing.
Vegetable	Corn	Golden Bantam Improved 12 Row	85	An improved version of the old standard yellow sweet corn. Instead of eight rows of kernels, this variety has 10-14rows and the ears are slightly longer. It was also selected to stay tender longer. 'Golden Bantam Improved 10 to 14 Row' was introduced in 1922 by the Everett B. Clark Seed Company of Milford, Connecticut and was developed as a selection of the 'Golden Bantam.'
Vegetable	Corn	Stowell's Evergreen	95	One of the oldest, if not the oldest, named sweet corn varieties in existence. It is a late season variety that yields 8" long ears that have anywhere from 10-14 rows of sweet, white, tender kernels. It keeps longer than most, which makes it one of the best heirloom varieties for the table, canning, and freezing. Because of these excellent traits, it has been a home garden and market grower favorite sweet corn variety since 1848.
Vegetable	Corn	Chinese Baby	83	Also known as Japanese Hulless corn, it grow 4-5' tall and bears 3-6 four" long ears. Pick early to eat as a baby corn, good in stir fries or on salads, or allow to mature to dry ears and use as a popcorn.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Armenian	50-75	Light-green, heavily ribbed fruit that grows 24-36" long x 3-4" diameter, best eaten at 12-18". Mild, sweet flavor with non-bitter skin. Can grow on a trellis for straight cucumbers or allow to ramble on the ground for interesting shaped fruit. Prolific and thrives in hot weather.

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Vegetable	Cucumber	Ashley	55-65	This variety has rapidly become the go-to cucumber for gardeners as well as market gardeners. Disease-resistant, heat tolerant, and less susceptible to powdery mildew, this variety is a great one to grow. Plants produce many cucumbers around 7-8" in length and are terrific for salads, pickles, and fresh eating. Ashley cucumbers are very low on vines making them easy to handle and harvest.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Beit Alpha	55	A delicious, very sweet cucumber that is usually picked small and does not need peeling, as the skin is very tender. This variety is very popular in the Mediterranean, having been developed in Israel at a kibbutz farm, and it is now becoming popular with Americans because of the fruit's fine flavor and high yields. This cuke is also burpless and has great shelf life. A parthenocarpic variety, you can grow in a greenhouse without pollinators.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Burpless Beauty	60	The super-productive vines yield loads of long, deep green cucumbers that stay crisp longer than any other we've tried. Pick and slice to reveal the pure white, firm flesh with an exceptionally small seed cavity. The thin-skinned cukes have the right balance of crispness and juiciness-and these mild beauties are easy on the digestion. Disease-resistant plants set fruits over several months.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Double Yield	50-60	Heirloom. Very productive variety, good to grow for gherkins, dills or fresh eating. Dark green slender fruits, 5-6" long by 2" diameter. High percent of sets produce two fruits at each leaf joint.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Early Fortune	55	A super dependable garden cucumber, great for pickles and slicing. Fruit grows 7 - 8" long, 2" in diameter.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Japanese "Tasty Green" F1	60	Crunchy, juicy and thin-skinned, long "burpless". These cucumbers combine vigor and productivity with fine sweet flavor and especially refreshing crispy texture. The vigorous vines bear early, yielding abundant slender 10-12" fruits that never need peeling.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Lemon	65	A gardener's favorite since 1894 but hard to find in grocery stores, this unusual, eye-catching, lemon-sized cucumber has excellent flavor and is a great slicer or pickler. It is scrumptious eaten with the skin and all just like you would an apple; non-bitter and burpless. Plants are more drought tolerant than other varieties.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Marketmore 76	70	Fruit averages 8-9" long, perfect for slicing. Dark green with thick protective skin, a perfect choice for market gardening as the rugged little fruit stand up well to shipping but still have the high quality of flavor and texture that grocery store cukes simply can't match!
Vegetable	Cucumber	Muncher	62	Dual purpose cucumber for both eating fresh and pickling. This tender variety is excellent for fresh eating right out of the garden. Muncher is nearly spineless. Fruits are 6-8" long and 3" wide, with strong vigorous vines. Non-bitter, burpless variety, can be eaten at any stage of growth. If using for pickles, pick when the fruits are 4-6" long.
Vegetable	Cucumber	National Pickling	55	This variety holds its quality longer than most and is a top-notch selection for pickling when harvested young. In smaller gardens, planting this pickling cucumber variety along a fence or trellis is the way to go! You can prepare flavorful and crunchy pickles with no bitterness every time.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Persian Baby "Green Fingers" (F1)	60	F1 Hybrid. Appetizing little Green Fingers are cute mini cucumbers that are smooth, thin-skinned, crispy, and ready to pick when just 3 to 5" long. The vigorous, powdery mildew tolerant vines are self-pollinating, early-bearing, and set fruits reliably even in difficult conditions. Enjoy these quality baby cucumbers all season long.

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Vegetable	Cucumber	Poona Kheera	50	Cultivated in Poona, India, this unusual variety changes color drastically with maturity and can be eaten at every stage. When young, bright yellow skin is produced which eventually turns a rosy russet color with age. Fantastic crunch and mild flavor, perfect for fresh eating. Heavy yields of 4-5" fruit that require trellising.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Shintokiwa	75	Smooth skinned, long and slender (like an English cuke), sweet, crisp, and juicy with no bitterness. Wonderfully productive. Trellis for straight 9-12" cukes or let sprawl for mostly straight and some with personality. Harvest on the thinner side for the best flavor.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Spring Burpless	52	These long, slender cukes offer a crisp, mild, bitter-free and burpless bite all season long. Firm and easy to peel, they should become your cucumber of choice. Expect Early Spring Burpless to reach 8-12" long in no time. For straight fruit, stake them on a cucumber support. Or, if you like the look of curly cukes, let them grow on the ground, where they'll twist up.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Straight Eight	58	An All-America Selections winner, Straight Eight has cool, firm flesh and a bright, sparky taste. For peak flavor and ultimate toothsome texture, pick when 8" long. Best grown on a fence or trellis.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Telegraph Improved	60	The English cucumber is longer (up to 18") and thinner than traditional cucumbers, with very small, soft seeds. 'Telegraph Improved' was developed in the 1800s for growing in greenhouses, but is now a favorite of home gardeners for the long, thin-skinned, burpless fruits that add a cool, mild flavor and a snappy crunch to salads and sandwiches. Best when trellised and watered regularly when fruit is forming.
Vegetable	Cucumber	Tokiwa Tokyo Green	60	Great Taste! The small, 9" fruit with tender skin and few seeds makes excellent pickles and sets the standard for slicing cucumbers; buttery soft, supremely sweet, and never bitter. This old Japanese variety, also known as "Tokyo Green," came from China in the Meiji era, then became the dominant variety sold around Tokyo. They do well on fences and trellises, saving space in the gardens. Vines are almost mildew proof and well adapted to hot, dry summers.
Vegetable	Eggplant	Aswad	80-85	This massive dark purple variety can grow up to 3 pounds or more. Its sweet and tender flesh makes it a delicious variety to grill or bake. Originally from Iraq, this variety is heat tolerant and will produce abundantly.
Vegetable	Eggplant	Black Beauty	75-80	A garden staple for over 100 years! Black Beauty has became the common market eggplant of today. This eggplant can be enjoyed roasted on salads or as a meat substitute but when harvested fresh, however, makes all the difference!
Vegetable	Eggplant	Casper	75	A true white eggplant. A rare Japanese variety that produces long 5-8" slender fruits that are creamy-white to almost pure white. Soft and small-seeded. When ripe the skin will lose its sheen and be slightly soft to the touch. Great in stir-fries and Italian dishes with its mushroom-like flavor and silky texture.
Vegetable	Eggplant	Diamond	70-75	Known for excellent texture and flavor, this variety bears dark-purple eggplants with green-tinted flesh that are 9" long and 3" in diameter. The fruits grow in clusters of four to six on 2' tall plants, disease-resistant, and rarely bitter. Great for roasting, baking, grilling and stewing!
Vegetable	Eggplant	Listada de Gandia	90	One of the most popular heirloom types, this one has 7" long fruit that is white with lovely bright purple stripes. It is so beautiful and has fabulous flavor with sweet, tender flesh. No need to peel! This excellent variety hails from Spain, a country that is renowned for fine food.

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Vegetable	Eggplant	Long Purple	70-80	The Long Purple eggplant is considered a favorite productive Italian type of eggplant! This eggplant is a an old heirloom that was first brought to America in the 1870's by B.K. Bliss of New York. This variety produces good yields of mildly flavored eggplants that are 8-10" long by 2" wide. The Long Purple has a dark purple and glossy skin with pale white flesh that has few seeds. This variety is the most flavorful and tender when harvested young at 5-6" long. The Long Purple is a great variety for slicing and adding to different Italian dishes, such as lasagna.
Vegetable	Eggplant	Louisiana Green	75-100	A southern heirloom variety, Louisiana Long Green produces extra sweet, long and slender fruits on tall, prolific plants. Downright non-bitter, these mild tender-skin Eggplants are velvety, pale lime-green with creamy-white flesh that is meaty and full-flavored. Pick them when they are slightly immature, before they are 9" long, for their texture and flavor. They are quick and easy to cook.
Vegetable	Eggplant	Rosa Bianca	80	A simply elegant eggplant from Sicily. Light pink-lavender fruit has soft white shading and a gently scalloped form. Mild flesh is very popular with chefs and gardeners alike! No bitterness. A great variety for heirloom market growers.
Vegetable	Eggplant	Snowy	65	A warm season tender annual, the unique color makes it a stand out variety. With uniform, 7" long ivory fruits that are firm and meaty, it holds up well in cooking where others may turn to mush. Can be adapted to containers, for those with limited garden space or short growing seasons.
Vegetable	Eggplant	Turkish Orange	70-80	This variety produces 4", round, deep orange fruits that resemble oranges hanging on a small tree! Beautiful green streaks add character with a flavor that is a bit softer than a traditional eggplant. This variety is soft and buttery when cooked or fried. The seeds are smaller and less noticeable which gives this variety a desirable texture for cooking. The richest flavored eggplant variety in the world.
Vegetable	Gourd	Green Bitter Melon	70	AKA Chinese bitter gourd. The fruits are excellent in broths, soups, or stirfries, and the leaves and shoots are also edible. Bitter melon is high in quinine, which gives the fruits their distinctive, mildly bitter taste. It is also used in traditional medicines for treating diabetes and digestive issues. This variety grows 8-10" inch long, green, thin-skinned fruit on vigorous vines. The slightly warty fruits should be harvested green and when under 8" long and 3" in diameter; once they begin to turn orange and ripen, the taste is less pleasing.
Vegetable	Gourd	Luffa	100	The fruit grows about 2', Tasty cooked like okra when young, edible when small and tender. Grow your own natural dishcloth or bath sponge.
Vegetable	Gourd	Оро	35-50	Bottle gourd, also known as bottle squash, calabash gourd, Doodhi, or Lowki is a delicious vegetable that has many uses. Its delicate nutty flavor adds greatly to hot curries as well as cooling yogurt dishes like Raita. It can be used like squash but it has a firmer, crisper texture. It is a light green variety, with uniform straight tender fruits, 1-1. 5 ft long.
Vegetable	Gourd	White Bitter Melon	55-65	This white color bitter gourd is a prolific India-type bitter gourd hybrid. Fruit size is about 11-12" long, weighing over a half pound. Bitter gourds are nutritionally dense and are recommended as a healthy food by the American Diabetic Association. The immature fruits, as well as the young shoots and leaves, are edible. Karellas are widely used in Southeast Asia and do well when incorporated into the cuisines of those areas.

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Vegetable	Melon	Boule D'Or	95-110	Very sweet, pale green flesh is just marvelous. Lovely yellow fruit has a unique, lacy netting, like a work of art. This truly incredible melon trialed with top marks. An all-time favorite honeydew type. Sugary flesh is so flavorful and rich. This variety is a dream for market growers and will command high prices with gourmets and chefs alike!
Vegetable	Melon	Canary	100	A bit larger than most cantaloupes or honeydews, the Canary Yellow Melon is as bright and cheerful as its name implies. It has a brightly-colored yellow rind, light-green flesh, and a sweet, delicate flavor. These melons store well and get up to 6 pounds. The rind will feel somewhat waxy when the melon is ripe.
Vegetable	Melon	Casaba Sungold	85-110	Sungold is the earliest ripener of the casaba melons, making it a good choice for short-season summers. Developed by a professor at the University of New Hampshire, the melon is 7"-8" long, acorn-shaped with a yellow-green rind, and weighs 6-9 lbs. Popular for its luscious flesh that is sweet and a bit spicy.
Vegetable	Melon	Eden's Gem	65-80	Productive, early-maturing variety. Developed in 1905 at Rocky Ford, Colorado as a "crate melon." Softball-sized netted fruits weigh in at about 1 pound. The green flesh has a complex spicy flavor.
Vegetable	Melon	Eel River	80-90	Like Crenshaw type melons, they are 3-5 lbs, slightly teardrop-shaped, and yellow/buff colored with green speckles. The incredibly aromatic orange flesh is very creamy and deliciously sweet.
Vegetable	Melon	Hami	80-100	Large, several pound melon well-known in China. It is similar in flavor to a sweet cantaloupe, and having a juicy white-orange pulp.
